



## How To Host A Blood Drive With The American Red Cross

1. Use [this spreadsheet](#) to locate the sponsor code for your university. It is important that this code (e.x. LambdaChiAlphaNorthwestern) is used by the Red Cross representative you speak to; it is how our unit totals are tracked across the fraternity!
2. Follow [this link](#) to submit a request for information on hosting a blood drive in your area.
3. Wait to hear from a representative from the Red Cross, and they will contact you with how to get started with preparing for the drive.
4. After finding a space to host the drive, recruit donors by tabling around the university or visiting meetings of different organizations on campus!
5. Once a date is confirmed, e-mail Noah Dial ([ndial@lambdachi.org](mailto:ndial@lambdachi.org)) the date of the drive, the unit goal, and the name and e-mail of the Red Cross representative you are working with.

**If you plan to donate and are blood types A-, B-, O+, or O-, consider doing a Power Red donation! Power Red donations are twice the amount of units and is less draining than a standard donation.**

**Most drives achieve a minimum of 35 units. Set 40 as your goal with your Red Cross representative.**
